Dr. Ragosta has been a member of the Cardiovascular Division since 1994. He completed his medical education at Brown University and completed an Internal Medicine Residency at Yale-New Haven Hospital. He then completed fellowships in Cardiology and Interventional Cardiology at the University of Virginia. Dr. Ragosta is board certified in Internal Medicine, Cardiovascular diseases and Interventional cardiology specializing in complex coronary interventions including intervention on chronic total occlusions, high risk intervention, interventions for hypertrophic cardiomyopathy and valvular heart valve disease intervention. He has served as principal investigator on numerous clinical trials in interventional cardiology. Dr. Ragosta previously served as the Director of the Catheterization Laboratories and Program Director for Interventional Cardiology for over 19 years. He is currently serving in his first three-year term as Vice President of the Clinical Staff and Chair of the Credentials Committee.

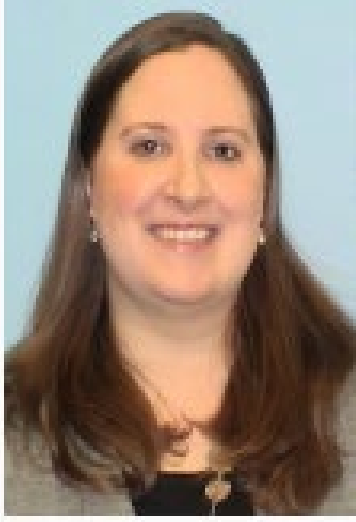


Amber Inofuentes, MD
Associate Professor of Medicine, Division of Medicine
Division Chief, Hospital Medicine

Dr. Inofuentes, MD, SFHM, joined UVA Faculty in the Section of Hospital Medicine in 2013. She completed her medical education at the University of Virginia followed by an Internal Medicine residency at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania. She is board certified in Internal Medicine and is maintaining certification with a focused practice in hospital medicine. Throughout her career, she has focused on quality improvement and clinical operations, serving as medical director for 3 Central Acute Care unit from 2014-2019. During her time as medical director, she helped launch a program focused on meeting the complex care needs of adult patients who are frequently hospitalized, which later moved under Population Health where it continues to thrive as the Medicine HOME program. In 2019, she became Associate Section Head for Quality & Operations for Hospital Medicine, and in late 2020 took over the group as Section Head. In her time leading the Hospital Medicine group, she has overseen significant clinical growth and expansion including throughout and beyond the COVID-19 pandemic, recruited more than 25 faculty members, and continued to lead a variety of quality improvement and patient safety initiatives. Work that she co-led from 2019-2023 to reduce medication errors for general medicine patients discharging to skilled nursing facilities was selected as the 2021 recipient of UVA Health's Charles L. Brown Award for Excellence in Patient Care Quality. In 2024, Hospital Medicine became its own Division within the Department of Medicine, at which time Dr. Inofuentes became its first Division Chief.

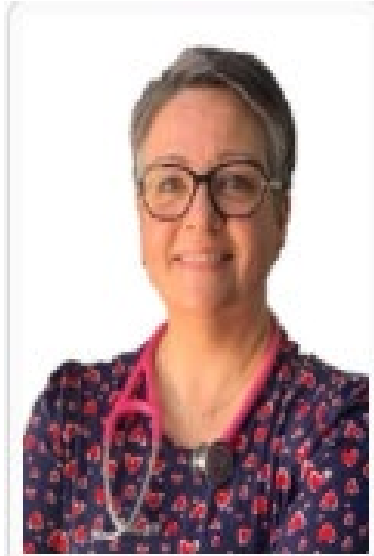

Sandra Custodio, AGPCNP-BC, born in Havana, Cuba, immigrated to the US in 1980 and grew up in Tampa, Florida. The heat of Florida took her travels to Massachusetts where she received her first Bachelor of Science degree in Athletic Training from Bridgewater State University. Working in both Sports Medicine and Occupational health, Sandra developed concussion protocols and policies for the local High Schools as well as re-vamping medical forms and Emergency Action Plans to use to ensure the safety of young athletes. A call to increase the depth of impact on patient care brought Sandra to MGH Institute of Health Professions to attain her BSN and then MSN. After completing her MSN, she began work at a Community Health Center with the immigrant and refugee population of Massachusetts. First working in primary care, and then pivoting to work in the Ryan White Clinic providing primary and ID care for persons living with HIV. She became the Associate Medical Director of the ID department, authoring new policies on STI care, confidential teen appointments, and served on the Massachusetts Mayor's council for Ryan White Part B funding and policy for 2 years. Meagan Miller, AG-ACNP
Department of Anesthesiology and Pain Management

Meagan grew up in Atlanta, Georgia, and earned her Bachelor of Science in Nursing from the University of Alabama. She later relocated to Nashville, Tennessee, where she worked as a bedside nurse at Vanderbilt University Medical Center (VUMC) while pursuing her Master of Science in Nursing from the University of Alabama at Birmingham, with a concentration in Adult-Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner and RN First Assist.

Following the completion of her graduate studies, Meagan accepted a position at VUMC in the Department of Anesthesiology, working with the Perioperative and Acute Pain Service as a Nurse Practitioner. Over nearly five years in this role, she played a key part in the development and implementation of several Enhanced Recovery After Surgery (ERAS) protocols. These initiatives focused on minimizing opioid use through the integration of multimodal analgesia and regional anesthesia techniques, contributing to decreased hospital length of stay and reduced opioid prescriptions at discharge. Meagan is also deeply committed to education and research. She has delivered local presentations and contributed to published research focused on opioid-sparing strategies in perioperative pain management.

She joined the University of Virginia in January 2025 and has been highly impressed by the institution's strong commitment to innovation, research, and comprehensive, patient-centered care. She also serves as a member of the Pain Task Force. Meagan is seeking her first three-year term as an advanced practice provider representative for the Clinical Staff Executive Committee.
